



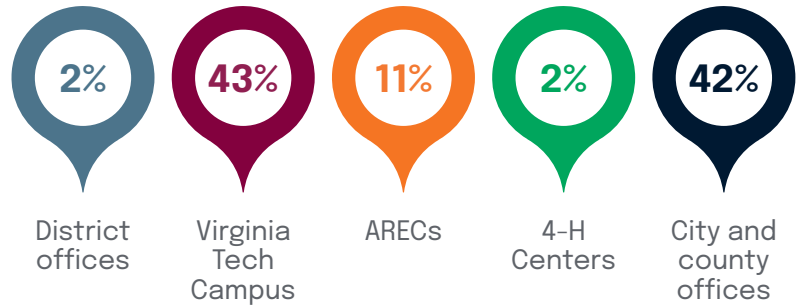

LOCATION OF RESEARCH AND EXTENSION PERSONNEL



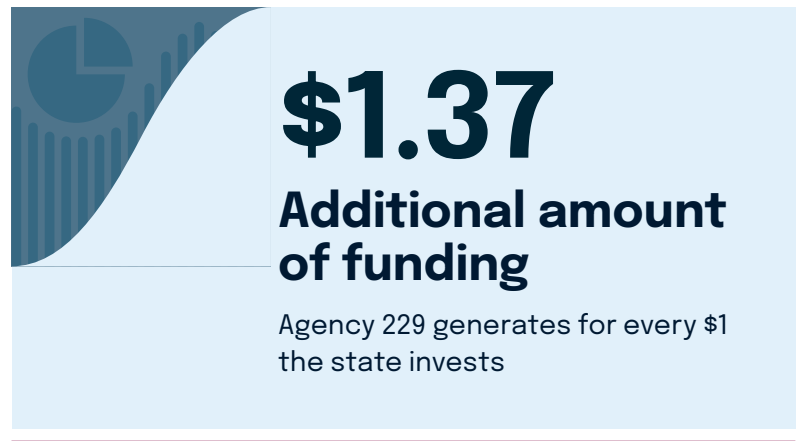

PUTTING RESEARCH IN THE HANDS OF VIRGINIANS

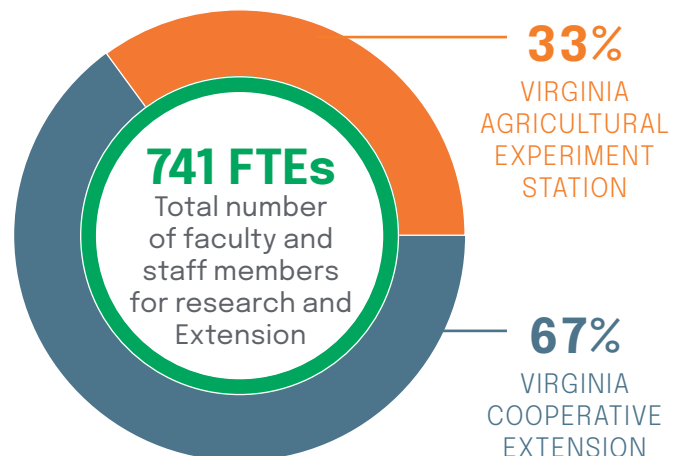

We are using drones on the Eastern Shore to help producers grow heartier crops, empowering youth in 4-H programs across the state, collaborating with companies in Southwest Virginia to grow their businesses, and partnering with producers in the Shenandoah Valley protect the environment.

Today, Extension operates out of 107 offices, 11 Research and Extension Centers, and six 4-H centers across the commonwealth. Our agents, specialists, and volunteers work to assist farmers, empower youth, guide responsible resource management, and advance the wellbeing of all Virginians.

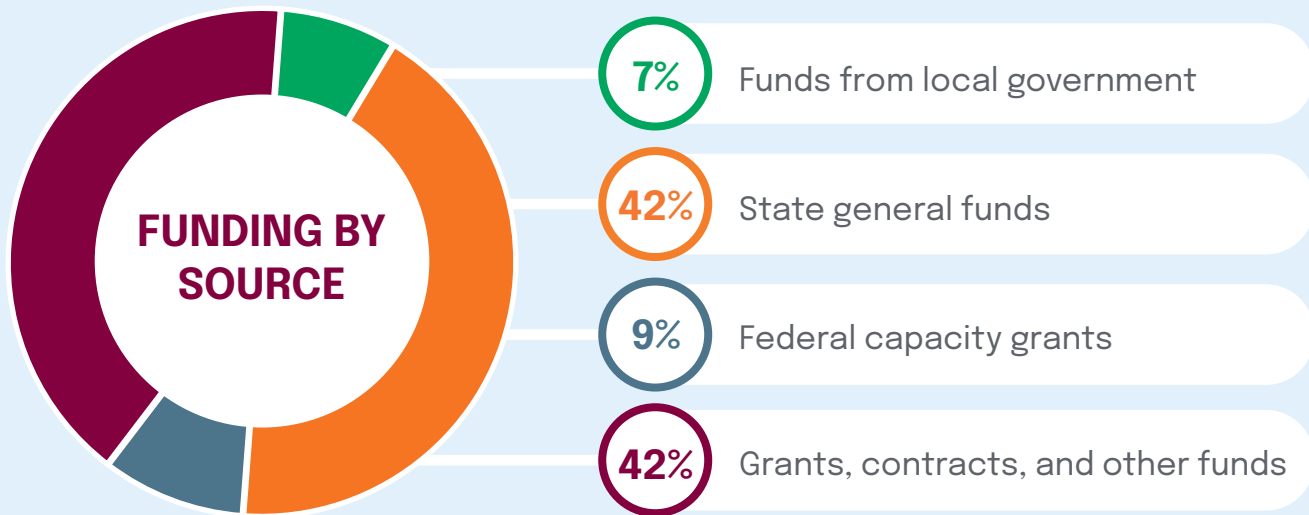
VIRGINIA AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION

The Virginia Agricultural Experiment Station includes faculty members in three colleges: the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, the College of Natural Resources and Environment, and the Virginia-Maryland College of Veterinary Medicine. The colleges work with the 11 Agricultural Research and Extension Centers located across the state.

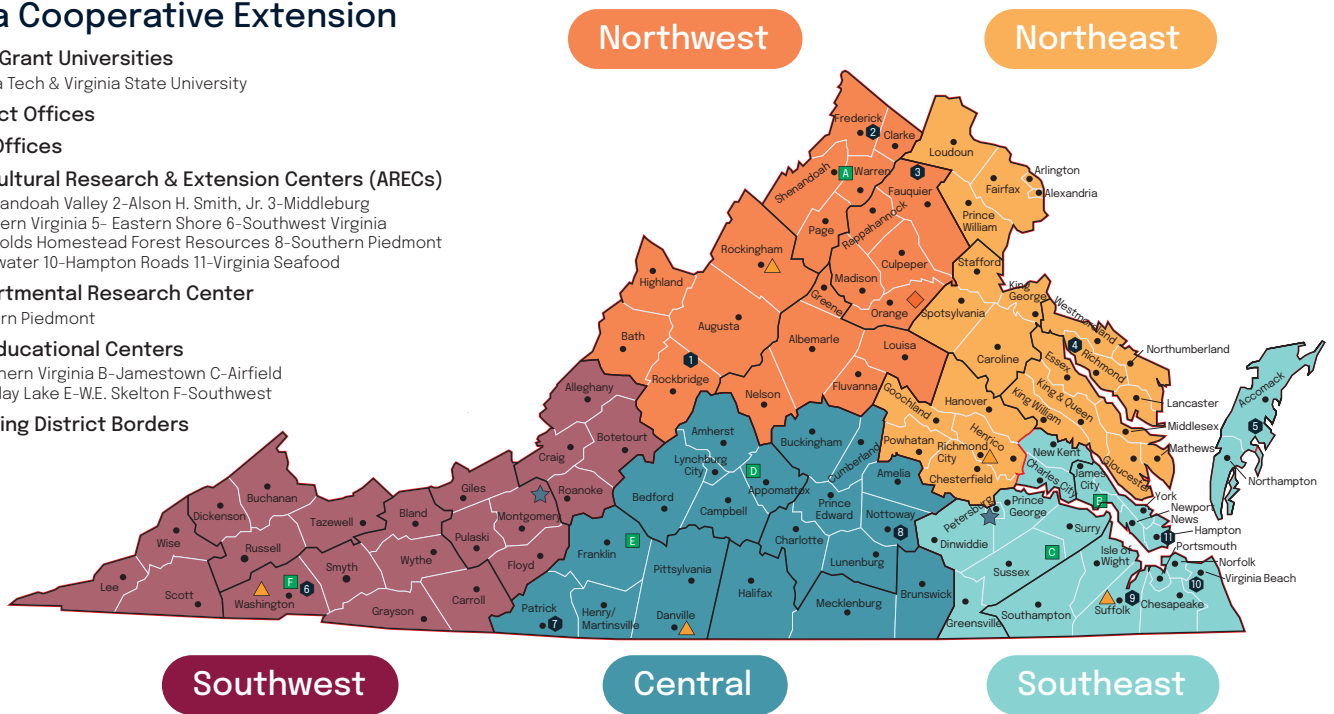
